C. Independent Student's Income Information to Be Verified

1. TAX RETURN FILERS—Important Note: If you (or your spouse, if married) filed, or will file, an amended 2022 IRS tax return, you must contact your financial aid office before completing this section.

Instructions: Complete this section if you, the student, filed or will file a 2022 income tax return with the IRS. *The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool that is part of FAFSA® on the Web. If you have not already used the tool, go to FAFSA.gov, log in to your FAFSA® record, select "Make FAFSA® Corrections," and navigate to the Financial Information section of the form. From there, follow the instructions to determine if you are eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2022 IRS income tax information into your FAFSA®. It takes up to two weeks for IRS income information to be available for the IRS Data Retrieval Tool for electronic IRS tax return filers, and up to eight weeks for paper IRS tax return filers. If you need more information about when, or how to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool see your financial aid office. **Note:** You cannot use the tool if you are married filing separately.*

Make sure to request the "IRS Tax Return transcript" and not the "IRS Tax Account transcript." You will need your Social Security Number, date of birth and the address on file with the IRS. (Typically this will be the address used when the 2022 IRS tax return was filed.) It takes up to two weeks for IRS income information to be available for electronic IRS tax return filers, and up to eight weeks for paper IRS tax return filers.*
