# F. Identity Confirmation (June 2025)

Federal regulations stipulate that students selected for V4 or V5 verification must have their identities confirmed. Acceptable forms of verification include, but are not limited to, valid, government-issued, unexpired documentation such as a driver's license, state-issued identification, or passport.

Effective June 2025, students have four options to fulfill this requirement:

- 1.) <u>In-Person Verification:</u> Students may appear in person at Indian River State College to verify their identity. An authorized IRSC employee will create a copy of the student's photo ID, annotating it with the date of receipt and the name of the official responsible for collecting the ID.
- 2.) Notarized Statement: Students can submit a notarized copy of the verification form along with their unexpired, valid, government-issued photo identification.
- 3.) <u>Recorded Video Call:</u> Students may schedule a recorded video call with a financial aid staff member, during which they must present their unexpired, valid, government-issued photo identification. To arrange this call, students should email <u>financialaid-info@irsc.edu.</u> An electronic copy and screenshots of the identification will be maintained in the student's financial aid file.
- 4.) <u>Third-Party Verification</u>: Identity verification may also be conducted by an entity compliant with the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Identity Assurance Level 2 (NIST IAL2). Please note that this option is pending further federal guidance.
