## **Admissions Criteria:**

- An A.A. Degree or A.S. Degree and a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA are required for program admission.
- Students who have completed an A.A. or A.S. Degree but have not completed all required Common Prerequisite courses may be eligible for provisional admission.

## **Foreign Language Requirement:**

## Internship/Thesis Guidance:

These classes provide opportunities for students to integrate knowledge acquired through the Business Administration program into an advanced internship experience or an original research project. Due to the demands of the internship/Thesis, registration in the final semester is generally limited to 12 credits. MAN 4940is recommended for online students or students already working in a business setting.
