Foreign Language Requirement:

Students who have not taken two years of the same foreign language in high school, must complete two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level to meet the foreign language requirement. See College Catalog.

Capstone Course Guidelines:

Students must have completed the foreign language requirement, all General Education, Technical Core courses and the majority of Criminal Justice courses, and must meet with an advisor in order to register for the Capstone course. Due to the demands of the Capstone course, registration in the final semester is generally limited to 12 credits.
