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THE MEDICAL CODER/BILLER

This program prepares students for employment in a variety of healthcare settings as an entry-level coder, medical record coder, coding technician or coding clerk. The content includes: medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, coding systems, fundamentals of disease process including pharmacology, healthcare delivery systems, basics of medical records services, ethical and legal responsibilities, safety/security procedures, basic data processing, and employability skills. The program consists of lecture, laboratory and a virtual and/or onsite practicum experience.

PROCESS FOR APPLYING ONLINE

APPLYING TO THE MEDICAL CODER/BILLER PROGRAM

Prior to beginning the application process:

1. Read the Medical Coder/Biller Application Booklet.
2. Complete and submit the IRSC Application for the Medical Coder/Biller program (\$30 fee; keep a copy of your receipt).

INTRODUCTION

The Medical Coder/Biller program is offered through the IRSC Health Sciences Division. Interested students must apply to the program. The program is offered as an online cohort program. Students must follow the curriculum schedule to complete the program.

APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS

Candidates who wish to be considered for the Medical Coder/Biller program at Indian River State College must complete the procedures outlined on the checklist on page 1. The IRSC Application for Admission should be completed at www.irsc.edu. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the application process is complete. No notices will be sent. Additional program specifics are outlined in this booklet.

PRE-ADMISSION ADVISEMENT

Pre-advisement is required for admission to the Medical Coder/Biller program. Pre-advisement includes information on the application process, admissions requirements, program guidance and counseling, financial aid, and time management.

APPLICANT REVIEW (completed by application deadline date)

Consideration for admission into the Medical Coder/Biller program will be based upon the following criteria:

1. Must have a standard High School Diploma or GED.
2. 2.5 IRSC and college cumulative GPA.
3. IRSC Admission Status must be complete.
4. Students must place into college level reading or have successfully completed **ENC1101 or higher**

ACCEPTANCE INTO PROGRAM

Applicants are provisionally accepted by a selective admission process. Students will then be notified to register for classes.

NON-ACCEPTANCE INTO PROGRAM

Applicants who do not qualify for the program will be notified via email, and student may call the Health and Human Science Department at 772-462-7550 for information regarding their application.

PROGRAM EXPENSES

In addition to this cost, the candidate should allow for room, board, transportation and personal living expenses. Note that non-Florida resident tuition is a higher rate per credit hour, which will increase total fees accordingly.

PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

Technical Standards for Admission and Progression*

Health Information Technology involves processing and analyzing health records and is characterized by the application of knowledge in the skillful performance of certain functions. Therefore, in order to be considered for admissions or to be retained in the program after admission, all students must be able to demonstrate the following abilities:

ISSUE	STANDARD	EXAMPLES OF NECESSARY ACTIVITIES (NOT ALL INCLUSIVE)
Critical Thinking/ Coping	Critical thinking ability sufficient for clinical judgment. Ability to make fast decisions in stressful situations in a professional manner.	Identify cause-effect relationships in professional practice situations, and display good coping mechanisms.
Interpersonal	Interpersonal abilities sufficient to interact with individuals, families, and groups from a variety of social, emotional, cultural, and intellectual backgrounds.	Establish rapport with clients and colleagues.
Communication	Communication abilities sufficient for interaction with others in verbal and written form.	Report data using appropriate data presentation techniques, and effective oral and written communication skills.
Mobility	Physical abilities sufficient to move from room to room and maneuver in small spaces.	Move around workspaces, file rooms and office areas.
Motor Skills	Gross and fine motor abilities sufficient to keyboard, file and code.	Use equipment, computers and encoders programs.
Visual	Visual ability sufficient for observation and assessment necessary in care of the client records.	Prepare and process health information accurately.
Tactile	Tactile ability sufficient for processing health data.	Perform filing, coding and preparing reports.
Hearing	Auditory ability sufficient to monitor and assess health needs.	Hear phones, alarms, emergency signals, and cries for help. Manage transcription reports accurately.
